Success in schools lies in the strength of believing that through their combined efforts, principals and their faculty can accomplish great things for the learning lives of students. Collective efficacy is about the overwhelming power that school teams have to impact change when they join together to solve problems. Collective efficacy is strong when educators believe that they are capable of helping students master complex content, fostering students' creativity, and getting students to believe they can do well in school. Expectations that they can successfully achieve their intended goals results in the confidence, resiliency, and persistence needed to overcome inequities and challenges. Many educators are asking: How do we foster a sense of collective efficacy amongst teachers to realize better outcomes for students? Information about how efficacy beliefs are formed and research-based strategies for fostering efficacy will be shared along with examples and success stories.

For over 35 years, he has delivered more than 3000 conference and program keynotes, professional development workshops, parenting seminars and student assemblies.
